

Grants for unconventional, public-facing artwork in surprising places

Rocket Grants program coordinator Julia Cole will make a presentation about how and why these grants (up to \$6,000) are available for artists and their teams to work in spaces around the city. She will also discuss the resources that are available to help you submit a strong application, and answer questions from the audience.

There will also be a brief talk and slideshow by 2015 *Rocket* Grants Award winner Keelin Austin from Harrison Street DIY, whose collaborative project Columbus Park Skate Park is still growing and bringing together their neighborhood. Keelin will talk about his team's experience applying for the grant, and how they used it to build neighborhood solidarity, leverage further grants and involve local kids in learning how DIY becomes DIWO.
